Dear Resident

On 14th October there will be a by-election in Frimley Green for a new Councillor at Surrey Heath Borough Council.

This is an exciting opportunity for residents to gain strong local representation at the council, to carry on the good work already in place by our MP Michael Gove as well as our County Councillor Paul Deach.

As a Frimley Green resident for 20 years and with a background in industries from defence to healthcare, delivering innovation and change, I am well placed to represent residents' views to the Council.

I live with my partner Inta, her 16 year old daughter, and the 3 children we are special guardians to aged 9,10 and 18. The youngest attends Frimley CofE school and the eldest is an apprentice at Direct Line.

I worked on the Frimley Green Traffic Lights issue from 2015 by liaising with local campaigners and lobbying Councillors to find a common-sense solution. More recently I organised leaflet distribution for the vote on the local residents' improved roundabout solution instead of traffic lights, which won 98% of the vote.

Communication lines between residents and local services need improvement, including with local Police, so that anti-social behaviour intervention takes place early, before it gets out of hand.

If you elect me on October 14th, I would look forward to closer and more proactive work with Michael Gove MP and County Councillor Paul Deach. Teamwork through all levels of government can deliver better solutions for residents in Frimley Green.

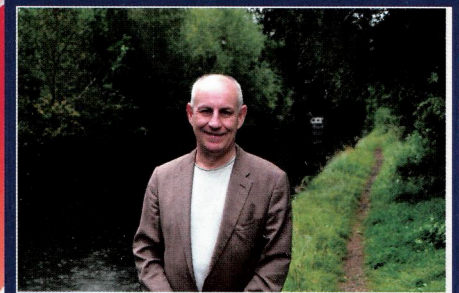
COVID COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Anti social behaviour has been an increasing problem. If elected, I will voice concerns to the council and work with Paul Deach, the Council and our MP to tackle anti-social behaviour and ensure residents' safety.

In 2017 a close friend of the family passed away. My partner & I took the decision to take her 3 children on as Special Guardians. Since then, I have worked to raise awareness and improve support for kinship carers across the UK.

MY PLAN TO TACKLE SURGING CAR CRIME

Recently there has been a surge in the number of cars that have been stolen in Frimley Green.

Key cloning technology has led to a number of cars being stolen from driveways, affecting a number of residents.

I have met with Surrey Police and Crime Commissioner Lisa Townsend to discuss this particularly concerning development.

If elected, I would encourage expansion of neighbourhood watch groups and CCTV coverage, to enable residents to reduce the risks of such crimes through knowledge and deterrence, and to assist the Police with detection.

I would also seek the support of our MP to lobby national government to put pressure on car manufacturers to address this vulnerability in car security.
